WATERWORKS RATE POLICY

On December 18th, 2013, Council passed a bylaw to fix the rates to be charged for the use and consumption of water, to fix the rates to be charged by way of rent and service charge for the use of the sewer, and to charge a monthly infrastructure fee for both.

Under this water rate policy bylaw 24-2013, the water rate is \$22 for the first 3,000 gallons of water and \$3 per 1,000 gallons in excess of 3,000 gallons; plus a water infrastructure charge of \$15.

The objective of the Waterworks rate policy is to work towards waterworks that are self-financing, and to set aside funds for future capital expenditures. Renewal and replacement of infrastructure is being prioritized and completed as funds allow. Council has completed a feasibility study for water source and water treatment plant upgrades. At this time, Council is exploring grant funding options to upgrade our water treatment plant and to find a more reliable water source.

This waterworks rate policy will work towards a financially independent waterworks that will not put demands on the municipal reserve fund.

WATERWORKS CAPITAL INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The objective of the waterworks capital investment strategy is to address anticipated waterworks infrastructure maintenance, the immediate drinking water infrastructure problems and future infrastructure replacements in a timely fashion so as to ensure the municipal waterworks provides safe drinking water to the community. The strategy uses the 2015 waterworks system assessment that was required by Saskatchewan Environment for infrastructure planning.

Comparison of water and sewer revenues to expenditures plus debt payments, expressed as a ratio:

<u>R</u> <u>\$308,597</u> = <mark>1.07</mark> (E + D) (\$243,757 + \$44,086)

So for 2020, water and sewer revenues covered 107% of the water and sewer expenditures.
