Schedule "B" Bylaw 2023

Schedule of Tipping Fees

1. Vehicles with household refuse/garbage

Small utility trailers or trunk of vehicle \$10.00 each

1/2 ton trucks & 1/2 ton trailers \$25.00 each

1 ton trucks \$50.00 each

3 ton trucks, single axle \$100.00 each

2. Household Special Items

Chester field, Love seats, Chesterfield chairs,

Easy chairs, and Carpets \$20.00 each

Fridges, stoves, washers (whites) \$20.00 each

Water heaters & smaller metal items \$10.00 each

Mattresses & Box Springs \$15.00 each

- 3. Any large renovation, demolition or construction material will require that each individual or contractor get their own waste bin at their own cost.
- 4. Prohibited Waste Animal carcasses, Antifreeze/Antifreeze Containers, Pesticide Containers, Fuel Tanks, Used Oil, Filters, and Containers, Asbestos, Asphalt Products including Shingles, Concrete, Tires, Batteries, Vehicle Bodies, Railroad Ties, Propane Bottles, Paint/Paint Cans, Hazardous Waste, Grain/Granaries, Contaminated Soil, and Electronics.
- 5. A \$5.00 administration fee is to be added to all accounts charged and not paid at time of disposal.

### **Snow Removal Policy**

We would like to remind you that the first streets to be attended to after a snowfall are Main Street, Prairie Avenue East (Main Street to the hospital) and Brock Avenue, from the hospital to #604, in that order.

The remaining streets will be done in the order determined by accumulation and need.

Snow removed from private property is NOT to be placed on boulevards at intersections or on any street or avenue.

Vehicles left over the legal parking limit on any street may be removed to accommodate snow removal.

(Snow ridges from the grader will be removed from driveways and walkways as soon as possible after the streets are cleared).

Make sure to keep your back alley way open as well. The tractor is quite large and needs as much room as possible when clearing alleys.

Please remember that there are lots of people and kids who are out walking. If you have a side walk, please remember to clear it off for everyone's safety.

Remember it is going to get slippery so please slow down and watch for residents that may be out walking and kids crossing streets!

### Moving Vehicles and Snow Removal

Town Staff would like to remind everyone to please not park or leave vehicles on the street. Parking vehicles on streets interferes with proper snow removal. We would also like to remind everyone to be cautious around snow removal equipment. For your safety, keep a fair distance away while they are in progress. Also please do not pile snow on other people's properties, on boulevards or in front of fire hydrants.
